## Easter Garden...

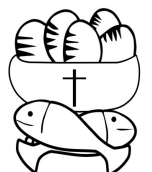

On Sunday we listened to the Gospel of John

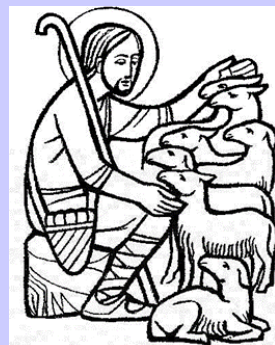


Dear Lord Jesus, The Good Shepherd,
