Dear Parents and Carers,

As you know, at St Eugene's we love to get out and about in London. We plan trips and invite interesting speakers into school to run workshops. We do not ask you to contribute for each individual trip or visitor, but do ask instead that you make an annual contribution. Over the course of the year, the cost of these for each child is roughly £50 with some things costing more and others less. For example the school pays £350 to use Grange Park for Sports Day, swimming for Y3 has cost £1100 and the recent Shakespeare workshops for Y3 and Y4 cost £865. As you can see, the school is already subsidising your child's trips and workshops. If you can, please make your £15 annual contribution via Parentpay, so that we can continue to run this enriching curriculum and give your child memorable learning experiences. Currently only 51% of parents have made their contribution. We need your support. Thank-you for your help with this and thank-you if you have already paid your donation.

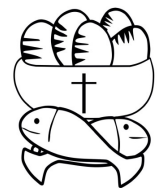
Swimming in Year 3
