I found some algae, pond snails, diving beetles and leeches.

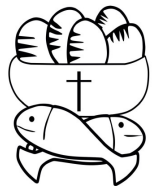


We found some spiders, centipedes, woodlice, slugs, snails, grasshoppers and worms.
