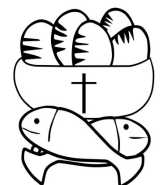
## Presentations to Parents...

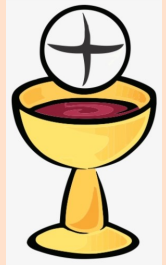
