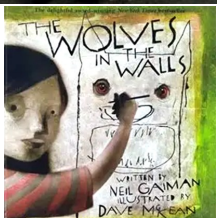


Work of the week...

Autumn is a wonderful time. We watch the light change and the leaves fall.

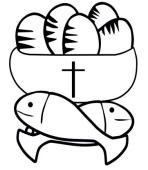


Father and Creator,
