Dear Parents and Carers,

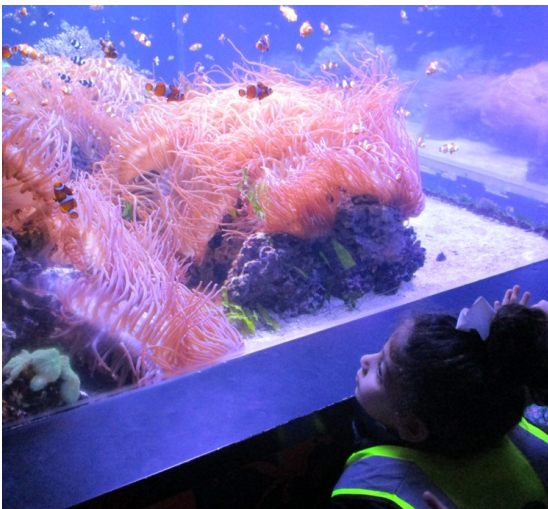
The school council raised £377 for the New Ways Charity with their charitable event: Movie Night. Thank-you very much for your contributions. Well done school council!
