Thank-you very much to the fire fighters for visiting us and for helping to keep us all safe when there is an emergency.



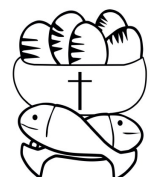
Do you have any questions about school life?

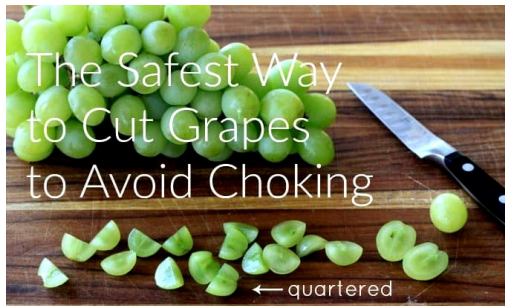
Stations of the cross
