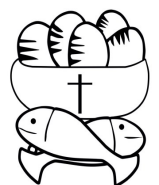

**Helping at the end of the event:** Helping to tidy everything away at the end of the BBQ is much appreciated. Children love to see their parents and carers being involved in school and community events.

There will be a bouncy castle, bouncy slide, tombola, dancing, face painting, sweets, treats and lots of fun family stalls. The bouncy castle and slide are only for school age children. Pre-school siblings will not be able to go on the bouncy castle or slide as we do not have insurance for that age group.

**Top prize for the raffle is £100 voucher + games and toys.** As always, there will be lots of super prizes, including some Arsenal goodies if we are lucky enough to get some more this time! Tickets for the BBQ will be on sale two weeks before the BBQ from Monday 22nd June.

In the event of poor weather this event will be cancelled. No refunds will be given. Instead, a BBQ event will be held for all the children in the school on a sunny afternoon during the summer term.
