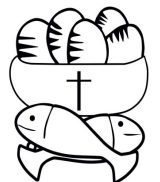
Do you have any questions about school life?

Pedestrian Skills Training

The safety of children on our roads is very important, particularly on regular journeys such as going to school. It is also vital that children are able, and allowed, to get around by walking, cycling and public transport. This helps keep them keep fit and mentally active, as well as developing good travel habits for life. Our Year 5 children took part in pedestrian skills training this week. They learnt lots of key skills that will help them keep themselves safe when they are out and about.



Which steps do you know?

Find a safe place to cross away from parked cars. If there is a zebra crossing, pelican crossing or traffic lights, cross there. Stop at the kerb, stand back from the edge. If traffic is coming, let it pass. Look left and right and all around. Keep looking and listening as you wait for the road to be clear of cars. Wait until it is safe to cross. Walk confidently as you cross the road in a straight line and keep looking and listening as you cross the road.
