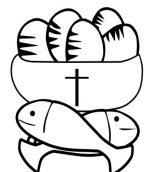
Do you have any questions about school life?

Every week a fantastic piece of children's work is showcased in the school lobby (next to the office). Do come and take a look:)



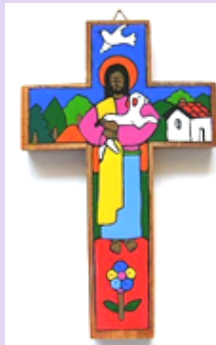
