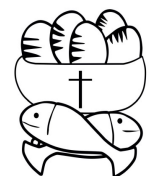

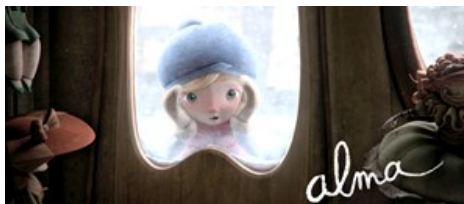


Work of the week...
