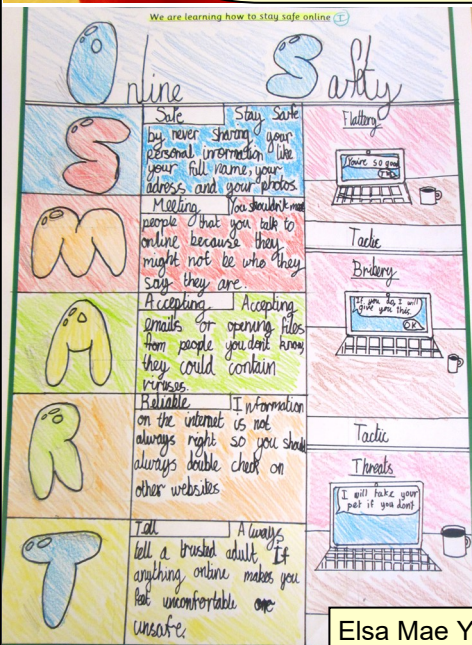


Keeping Safe Studies...

The children are either reading and learning their phonics (Year R, 1 and 2) or starting their maths or English (Years 3,4,5 and 6) at 9am.
